FINANCIAL SUMMARY  
SIX MONTHS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2017

**Results of Operations for the First Six months of Fiscal Year 2017/2018**

We reflected net income of \$40,000 from operations for the first six months of our 2017/2018 fiscal year. Overall, this result was \$12,000 ahead of our 2017/2018 budget and a \$53,000 improvement from the first six months of our previous fiscal year 2016/2017.

The following are operating highlights for the first six months of 2017/2018 compared to our current-period year-to-date budgeted expectations and to the first six months of our previous fiscal year:

- Unrestricted collections were \$350,000, approximately \$26,000 behind budget but a \$20,000, or 6%, improvement from our first six months of the prior fiscal year.
- Restricted collections were \$128,000, approximately \$25,000 ahead of budget and \$7,000, or 6%, better than the first six months of the previous fiscal year. Increased contributions to support our buildings and grounds were the primary driver of the increase in restricted collections.
- Parish expenses were \$459,000, approximately \$11,000 better than budget and \$18,000 lower than the first six months of the previous fiscal year. An \$11,000 reduction in payroll and benefits expense primarily drove the reduction in expenses from the prior fiscal year.

**Cash on Hand**

We finished the six months ended December 31, 2017 with \$329,000 in our checking and savings accounts, approximately \$26,000 lower than on June 30, 2017, primarily driven by cash outlays to improve or repair our church building and our organ.

**Debt**

Loans payable at December 31, 2017 totaled \$302,000. We are currently making monthly payments of \$2,642 (principal plus 3.00% interest). Once we finalize our current building repair and begin paying down our currently-open credit line, our expected monthly debt service is estimated to reach approximately \$4,600 per month or \$55,200 annually.
